S.S. Imperator. Damaged by Fire

The stemship Imperator, largest afloat, swept by fire to-day at dock in Hoboken with crew and over a thousand passengers aboard. Second officer Gobrecht who led the crew into the hold to fight the flames got cut off from his men and enveloped in a cloud of smoke and suffocated. The body was recovered untouched by fire; one seaman also perished. Tons of water were poured into the hold. water were poured into the hold. When the fire was checked the vessel had listed fifteen degrees. The passengers were aroused from sleep by the crackling of flames and rushed panic stricken from the pier.
