Storm-Tossed Craft Reaches Port.

The schooner H. W. Wentzel, Aubrey Brown, master, which left here on Monday night last, laden with sup-plies for King's Cove, and was caught out in the terrific storm of the fol-lowing night, was towed into this port this meaning by the tug John Green this morning by the tug John Green, having failed to reach her destination. The Wentzel made a good run after leaving St. John's and everything went, smoothly until the afternoon of Tuesday when a heavy westerly gale came on with huge seas constantly sweepon with huge seas constantly sweep-ing over the craft. She reached with-in nine miles of the home port and then was forced to retreat by wind and sea. On Tuesday night a regular hurricane raged and almost every stitch of canvas that the craft had was blown away Besides everything stitch of canvas that the craft had was blown away. Besides everything movable on deck was damaged or de-stroyed. The forecastle was flooded by the waves and to make matters worse the schooner's rudder was car-ried away. Those on board spent an anxious time of it and thought their craft would never survive the storm. Skipper Brown, however, believed the staunch old packet would live it out and he was not disappointed, as after drifting about disabled and helpless for over two days the schooner was drifting about disabled and helpless for over two days the schooner was picked up this morning off Cape Spear and brought to port.
