**RELIC OF BARBARISM.**—The new whipping post and story, recently erected in the jail-yard at New Castle, Del., to take the place of the ancient and discredited one, was inaugurated on Saturday by the pillorying of three men convicted of petty offences, and the flogging of ten convicted of like misdemeanors. A large crowd of gaping men, women and children witnessed the spectacle. The heaviest whipping was received by a coloured man, whose offence was assaulting a white girl. He got thirty lashes on the bare back. Two other coloured men, for petty larceny, received twenty lashes each. A great many papers have raised a cry against what they term this "return of barbarism." But it is nevertheless a fact, well proven in England, that there is a certain class of criminals who care little for imprisonment, but who are in a great measure deterred from crime by the fear of corporal punishment. When garrotting was rife in England, imprisonment was found to be a very inefficient punishment, but as soon as flogging was introduced as a special penalty for this crime, the perpetration of the offence died out at once.
