WHO OWNS THE POLE?

The Question of Sovereignty May Be Difficult to Decide.

Pittsburg, Pa., Sept. 7.-Mr. L. W. Strayer, staff correspondent of the Pittsburg Dispatch, telegraphs from Washington, D.C., as follows: The question of wnership and sovereignty over the North Pole is strictly an academic one at this time. There is nothing tangible about it. There is too much uncertainty about what Dr. Cook found for an official of the state department to discuss what action may be taken by the United States Government looking to a formal claim of sovereignty over that region. This statement was made today by Assistant Secretary of State Adee, who is acting as secretary in the absence of Secretary Knox. Like everyone else in Washington Mr. Adee is intensely interested in the great achievement of Dr. Cook. There seems little doubt that if the later and official reports of the Brooklyn explorer should bear out the first accounts of his accomplishments this Government will lay formal claim to the ownership of

the region about the Pole.

Annexing Ice Is Difficult. If Dr. Cook had found solid territory at the world's extremity, the procedure would have been simplified. Whether the rights of discovery extend to a floating ice field is something yet to be determined by the authorities on international law. It is an accepted principle of international law that all the seas are free for navigation, and there is doubt whether claim of territorial possession can be made for the region about the Pole, which appears to be a field of drifting ice. From what Mr. Adee says it will be necessary for this Government to make formal claim and take possession of the North Pole before the right of ownership may be established. The United States has acquired territory by discovery one instance. What is known as the Midway Island was discovered back in 1863 by the commander of an American

naval vessel. Our Government has formally appropriated this island, which is occupied as a cable station. The maps have always shown it as part of the Hawaiian group, but in our orignal treaty with Hawaii, before annexing hat group, the Island of Midway was xcluded from Hawaiian jurisdiction. It is recalled that no claim of sovereignty has ever been made by this Govother American explorers. None of the discoveries in the Arctic or the Antarctic by Americans was followed by fornal ownership claims by this Government. The claim of ownership must be followed by formal occupation, also the mere discovery by an American citizen does not give ownership to his country without formal act by such Government.
