

BERLIN TO TRY OUT . TRACKLESS TROLLEY

One Man Cars For Suburbs Also Desired by Director of Railways.

Berlin, Sept. 13.-Berlin hopes to find a solution for financing its street railways by introducing trackless trolley cars and by using cars operated entirely by one man in the suburbs. Dr. Adler, municipal director of street railways, whom the street car unions kept in office last spring by threatening a general strike if he were dismissed, angeneral strike if he were dismissed, announced that he would experiment with trackless trolley cars, which not only will obviate the expense of 1,500,000 marks per kilometer for tracks, but will be even cheaper to operate than automobile buses, as the street cars cost only three marks per kilometer to run, as against five and a half marks for buses.


