"The American Federation of Catholio Societies, in national convention assembled, at the city of Chicago, on the 5th, 6th and 7th of August, 1902, tion and sentiments

"Resolved. That this organization has for its object the spread of fraternal relations amongst the various Catholic societies throughout the United States, in the hope that, through the larger experience and knowledge acquired from mutual contact, each and all may increase in membership, improve in organization and methods of administration, and be made more effective as instruments for the inculcation of practical consequent sound citizenship, thus doing better work ban ever before for God, for country and for truth

THE POPE AND THE HIERARCHY "Resolved. That we declare out filial devotion and loyalty, to our Holy Mother, the Church, and to the representative of her divine founder. our Holy Father, the Pope, and that we piedgo to both our best and untiring efforts in the carrying out of their beneficent mission. We recognire in the Sovereign Pontiff Pope Leo XIII. the one who, enlightened by divine grace, has in his various encyclicals extended to the world teachings which, if accepted and faithfully observed, will uplift mankind to a higher plane of contentment and happiness. We, therefore, sincerely recommend to the faithful and those outside of the communion of our Church the study of the lucid explanations of Christian teaching contained in the several letters of the Holy Father, and to urge them to carry out the advice which is given us so lovingly and forcibly there-

"To the Catholic hierarchy and clergy we pledge our loyal support and co-operation in their great labors for the promotion of religion, morality and Christian education.



> "Resolved. That it is our belief that all that is required to speedily put a stop to the whole anti-friar agitation is an honest and impartial enforcement of the laws of the United States, giving protection to life and property.

THE CATHOLIC PRESS.

"We pledge our encouragement and support to the Catholic press of the nation and hereby express our appreciation of its staunch defense of Catholic rights and interests Wo Irio Ipon American Catholics a full and liberal support of our Catholic papers and magazines and the cacouragement of Catholic literature We consider this absolutely necessary in view of the fact that calumnies against the Church and its niembers are being actively and widely circulated in a so-called stanfard work under the authority of a great publisber in this country.

Liberty, for us, only begins with the power of continuating the rights of others, and a Frenchman nover feels burnself fully free until bo is oppressing somebody. This seems rather strained, but it is true, at least of the false Republicans who are now governing the country and who have shown themselves more arbitrary, more petty-minded in devising means for inflicting injury or annovance on those over whom then have authority, and more tyrannical In fact than any of the Monarchs who have had reputations for cruelty and blood-thirstyness.

Since the putting into execution of the iniquitious decrees against the teaching Nuns in France there has been a good deal of misuaderstanding about the legal position of the religious establishments. It was generally, supposed that the Convents which were closed were all "unauthorized." This is a mistake and it is shown to be so by such different authorities as The Temps and the Arch. bishop of Albi. The Temps points out that the Government stultifled Itself. It gave out that evergetic measures were to be taken against religious establishments "which had pornisted in not applying for authorization." The. Temps says that there is strange irony in reproaching these establishments with "alleged" resistance when they were kut supposed to know more about the precise signification of the law than M. Waldeck-Rousseau. himself. Furthermore, the circular of the 15th of July last told the Congregations that it was too late to, have their establishments authorized. The Archbishop of Albi practically, points out the same thing in his pathetic letter to the Reverend Mother Superior of the "Filles dec-Jesus," who have been ordered out of his diocese. The Archbishop, while dwelling on the injustice done to the None, gives them sound advice as tohow they are to act for the purpose of obtaining redress in a legal and constitutional manner
