

TRACES: CONTEMPORARY CANADIAN DRAWINGS

TRACES presents a group of works which indicate some of the directions explored by today's artists.

Relying on an expanded set of means and tools, contemporary art has necessitated, especially in the second half of this century, a constant reassessment of art history's traditional categories, as well as a renewal of critical methodologies. TRACES presents twenty-four works by Canadian artists. It offers a set of propositions which translate some of the preoccupations characterizing drawing's resurgence in the art of the eighties.

Avoiding the limitations of traditional categories, TRACES juxtaposes approaches diametrically opposed to one another and highlights the vast diversity that embraces art of the eighties. It wishes to counteract the

myth of a romantic return to painting enthusiastic. 'that fashion attempts to impose on the every night.' art of this decade.

TORONTO DANCE THEATRE TO LATIN AMERICA


The dancers in this company have always been singled out for their excellence.
