

ARTICLE III

The Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics undertakes to cooperate with the Government of Canada in light of the development of fisheries relations between the two countries pursuant to the provisions of this Article, in scientific research required for the purposes of rational management, conservation and optimum utilization of the living resources of the areas described in paragraph (1) of Article II. For these purposes, scientists of the two sides shall consult regarding the conduct of such research and the analysis and interpretation of the results obtained.

ARTICLE IV

The Government of Canada undertakes to authorize USSR vessels licenced to fish or to support fishing operations pursuant to the provisions of Article II, to enter Canadian Atlantic and Pacific ports, in accordance with Canadian laws, regulations and administrative requirements, for the purpose of purchasing bait, supplies or outfits, or effecting repairs, and such other purposes as may be determined by the Government of Canada, subject to the availability of facilities for these purposes and the needs of Canadian vessels. Such authorization shall become null and void in respect of any vessel upon the cancellation or termination of its licence to fish or to support fishing operations, except for the purpose of entering port to purchase supplies or effect repairs necessary for its outward voyage.

ARTICLE V

1. The Government of Canada and the Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics recognize that States in whose fresh waters anadromous stocks originate have the primary interest in and responsibility for such stocks and agree in principle that fishing for anadromous species should not be conducted in areas beyond the limits of national fisheries jurisdiction. They will continue to work together for the establishment of permanent multilateral arrangements reflecting this position, taking into account all relevant factors.

2. Pursuant to paragraph (1), the Government of Canada and the Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics shall take measures to ensure that their nationals and vessels avoid the taking of anadromous stocks spawned in waters under the jurisdiction of the other Party.

ARTICLE VI

The Government of Canada and the Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics undertake to cooperate directly or through appropriate international organizations to ensure proper management and conservation of the living resources of the high seas beyond the limits of national fisheries jurisdiction, including areas of the high seas beyond and immediately adjacent to the areas under their respective fisheries jurisdiction, taking into account their interests in such resources.
