PRAYERS.

By unanimous consent, pursuant to Standing Order 43, it was ordered,—That the question of the lack of any redress on the part of the House of Commons when a confidential document in the possession of the Government is made public without authorization be referred to the Standing Committee on Procedure and Organization for consideration and report.

The Order being read for the report stage of Bill C-214, An Act to amend the Canada Labour (Standards) Code, as reported (without amendment) from the Standing Committee on Labour, Manpower and Immigration.

Mr. Knowles (Winnipeg North Centre), seconded by Mrs. MacInnis, moved,—That Bill C-214, An Act to amend the Canada Labour (Standards) Code, be amended by deleting from lines 12 and 13 thereof the words “one dollar and sixty-five cents”, and by substituting therefor the words “two dollars”.

After debate thereon, the question being put on the said motion, it was negatived on the following division:
