A Message was brought from the House of Commons by their Clerk, in the following words:-

Resolved,—That this House do concur in the Address of the Senate to His Excellency the Governor General, respectfully requesting that His Excellency may be pleased to transmit the Joint Address to Her Most Excellent Majesty the Queen offering congratulations on the birth of a Prince; and

That the words "and Commons" be inserted in the said Address from the Senate.

Ordered,—That a Message be sent to the Senate informing their Honours that this House doth unite with the Senate in the said Address.

The Honourable Senator Connolly, P.C., moved, for the Honourable Senator Connolly (*Halifax North*), seconded by the Honourable Senator Lambert, that the report be adopted now.

The question being put on the motion, it was— Resolved in the affirmative.

With leave of the Senate.

The Honourable Senator Connolly, P.C., moved, seconded by the Honourable Senator Lambert, that the Bill, as amended, be read the third time now.

The question being put on the motion, it was— Resolved in the affirmative.

The Bill, as amended, was then read the third time.

The question was put whether this Bill, as amended, shall pass. It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill, with three amendments, to which they desire their concurrence.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Senate resumed the debate on the motion of the Honourable Senator Bouffard, seconded by the Honourable Senator Beaubien (*Provencher*), for second reading of the Bill S-7, intituled: "An Act to amend the Canada Shipping Act".

After debate,

The Honourable Senator Connolly, P.C., moved, for the Honourable Senator Hayden, seconded by the Honourable Senator Lambert, that further debate on the motion be adjourned until the next sitting of the Senate.

The question being put on the motion, it was— Resolved in the affirmative. 91
