Mr. McGrath: Put the motion.

Mr. Paproski: Put the motion. The motion comes first.

Mr. Baldwin: I rise on a question of privilege, Mr. Chairman. The motion for adjournment has been made. It must be put forthwith. There can be no debate, no point of order, no discussion.

Mr. Gray: I would like to speak, Mr. Chairman.

Some hon. Members: Order.

Some hon. Members: Shame.

Mr. Gray: Mr. Chairman—

Some hon. Members: Order.

The Assistant Deputy Chairman: Order.

Mr. Bell: You must put the motion. You have been waiting 15 minutes to put the motion.

The Assistant Deputy Chairman: Yes, order.

Mr. McGrath: I rise on a question of privilege, Mr. Chairman.

The Assistant Deputy Chairman: Will you resume your seat. I recognized the minister on a point of order.

Mr. McGrath: You cannot. I rise on a question of privilege, Mr. Chairman.

Mr. Lambert (Edmonton West): Question.

The Assistant Deputy Chairman: Order, please. The hon. member for St. John's East moved that the committee rise, report progress and ask for leave to sit again.

Some hon. Members: Carried.

The Assistant Deputy Chairman: Is the committee ready for the question? All those in favour of the motion.

Mr. Bell: Gibson, out. You were not here all the time.

Some hon. Members: Deachman, out.

The Assistant Deputy Chairman: Order.

Mr. Bell: The Liberal whip just came in. Out.

Some hon. Members: Order.

The Assistant Deputy Chairman: All those against the motion?

Mr. Bell: This is phony. They cannot come in.

The Assistant Deputy Chairman: Those against the motion please rise.

Mr. Bell: Oh, no. This is a farce.

Mr. McGrath: To hell with this. This is disgraceful.

Mr. Crouse: The Chairman should resign.

The Assistant Deputy Chairman: Will all hon. members resume their seats, please.

Mr. Lambert (Edmonton West): Out you go.

Mr. Bell: Rotten.

The Assistant Deputy Chairman: Will hon. members resume their seats.

Some hon. Members: Resign. Leave the chair.

The Assistant Deputy Chairman: Standing Order 12(2) reads:

When Mr. Speaker is putting a question, no member shall enter, walk out of or across the House, or make any noise or disturbance.

Mr. Bell: They must leave.

An hon. Member: Put the motion.

The Assistant Deputy Chairman: I read the rule so that if any hon. member has not followed the rule he will remember that.

Mr. Lambert (Edmonton West): Deachman, out.

Mr. Bell: The Liberal whip sneaked in. Leaky Dick sneaked in.

The Assistant Deputy Chairman: All the hon. members who heard me read the rule, will please take note. All hon. members opposed to the motion, please rise.

Some hon. Members: Oh, oh.

Mr. Bell: That is rotten. It is a sham.

Some hon. Members: Shame.

An hon. Member: How can you do it?

Mr. Horner: They did not win on the first count so they want to win on the second. How rotten can you get.
