and retain their precedence; otherwise they will disappear from the order paper. They may, however, be renewed.

- (2) Orders not proceeded with when Dropped called, upon the like request, may be allowed to stand retaining their precedence; otherwise they shall be dropped and be placed on the order paper for the next sitting after those of the same class at a similar stage.
- (3) All orders not disposed of at Orders the adjournment of the House shall be postponed until the next sitting day, without a motion to that effect.
- 20. (1) The day to day precedence Precedence on the order paper, except as otherwise on order paper. provided, shall be as follows:
 - (a) Third reading of bills.
 - (b) Reports received from committees of the whole House.
 - (c) Bills reported after second reading from any standing or special committee for reference to a committee of the whole House.
