No. 1.

By the Honourable Mr. David:—

November 28—That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General; praying that His Excellency will cause to be laid before the Senate a copy of all papers and correspondence having reference to the calling out of militia and to the intervention of the Government in the late strikes and riots in Hamilton and Buckingham.

No. 2.

By the Honourable Mr. Landry:—

November 30—That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General; praying that His Excellency will cause to be laid upon the Table of the Senate copies of all letters received by any of the members of the Government from applicants for appointment to the Senate to fill the seats made vacant by the lamented death of our late colleagues the Hon.
