Apprenticeship after degree  
is obtained*

The following is an extract from the minutes of a meeting of the Faculty of Law held in the office of the Dean on Wednesday, October 15th, 1924, at 5.15 p.m.

"WHEREAS many practitioners complain that the time spent in attendance at lectures and in studying for examinations so restricts the attendance of students in offices that the practical training there received is in most cases altogether inadequate.

"AND WHEREAS this Faculty is of opinion that the time spent by students in office attendance seriously interferes with their university studies.

"AND WHEREAS this Faculty is of opinion that it is desirable that the periods devoted to the systematic study of law and to practical office training be separated.

"AND WHEREAS it is also of opinion that three years should be devoted exclusively to the systematic study of law and that the experience gained in one year's attendance in a law office during ordinary office hours after completion of the university law course and the passing of all examinations would be more than the equivalent of the office training now received.
