Owing to the scarcity of railway construction labor, caused by the exodus of foreigners during the Balkan war last fall, construction on this portion of the transcontinental has been at a standstill during the winter months. It is now under full swing again, however, and the contractors promise completion of the remaining portion of the Cochrane-Quebec connection by September next. Construcnection by September next. Construc-tion trains are now being operated to a distance of more than two hundred miles east of Cochrane.
