

G.T.P. WILL HELP MOVE GRAIN CROP

Construction of the Cochrane-Quebec Section Will Be Rushed.

The World was informed by an official of the Grand Trunk yesterday that the construction of the Cochrane-Quebec section of the transcontinental line, instead of sending laborers to western Canada to work on the western portion of the line, is this spring being done by the Grand Trunk in the eastern provinces to work on the completion of the Cochrane-Quebec section of the line.

Owing to the necessity of railway construction labor, caused by the exodus of foreigners during the Balkan war last fall, construction on this portion of the transcontinental line at a standstill during the winter months. It is now under full swing and the completion of the section between the Cochrane-Quebec section and the rest of the line is being pushed forward. Construction trains are now being operated to a distance of more than two hundred miles east of Cochrane.

The completion of this portion of the line, said Mr. Charlton, official of the Grand Trunk, will mean that the Grand Trunk will be able to move the 1913 western grain crop of Canada.

The combined receipts of live stock at the two markets show an increase of 104 cattle, 116 hogs, 86 calves, but a decrease of 32 sheep, but a decrease of 24 horses, in comparison with the corresponding week of 1912.

At the City Yards the above figures show a decrease of 91 cattle, 2407 hogs, 67 calves and 10 horses, but an increase of 12 horses, compared with the corresponding week of 1912.

At the Union Yards these figures show an increase of 195 cattle, 1663 hogs, 132 sheep, 86 calves, but a decrease of 36 horses, compared with the same week of 1912.

UNION STOCK YARDS.

The receipts of live stock at the Union Yards on Friday were 43 cattle, 157 hogs, 116 calves, 220 sheep, but no horses. Duns and calves sold 35 cents of hogs at \$6.00, f.o.b. cars.

Rice and wheat sold 200 hogs at \$9.85, fed and watered.
