

EXTREME APATHY IN NEW YORK MARKET

Trading Diminished Fifty Per Cent. and Was of Professional Nature.

DEPRESSING FACTORS

War, Revival of Mexican Situation and Congress Gives Unfavorable Tone.

NEW YORK, May 25.—The most conspicuous feature of today's stock market was its extreme apathy. Compared with the previous day, trading diminished over fifty per cent. Another feature of the session was its purely professional character. There being an absolute absence of public inquiry. Dealings were again limited to the so-called war specialists, with the outcome that the market was depressed more or less heavily.

Opening prices were irregular, and this was maintained, subject to slight changes, until the afternoon, when gradual recovery took place in all branches of the list. The movement began with an abrupt break in Rock Island, following news from Washington that the Interstate Commerce Commission would resume its investigation into the financial affairs of that system. Final sales showed net losses of one to two points in a number of issues, including United States Steel, Reading and St. Paul.

In the early portions, such shares as Republic Steel (common and preferred), United States Steel, American Can, and some of the copper and motor, made gains of one to three points. The optimistic news from Washington, that the Interstate Commerce Commission would resume its investigation into the financial affairs of that system, was lost because of the failure of the Republic Steel directors to take expected action on the preferred stock.

Depressing factors.

Foreign and domestic developments are of a nature to depress the market. Cables from London told of the poor success of new capital undertakings, and bore intimations of an unfavorable reply to this government. Revival of the Mexican situation, and the possibility of a new session of congress were among the adverse home conditions. The optimistic news from Washington, that the Interstate Commerce Commission would resume its investigation into the financial affairs of that system, was lost because of the failure of the Republic Steel directors to take expected action on the preferred stock.

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DOMINEER HOPE TOPAY-DIVIDEND

Vice-President W. T. Edwards Made Cheery Announcement Yesterday.

WILL INCREASE OUTPUT

Mine Will Be Able to Mill Thirty Thousand Tons of Ore Monthly.

The annual meeting of the Dome Mines, Limited, was held at the offices of Beatty, Blackstock, Fadden and Co., 58 Wellington street east, yesterday. The attendance was small and the meeting exceedingly harmonious.

In the absence of Cap. De La Mar, W. T. Edwards, the vice-president, conducted the meeting. Many shareholders expected a dividend announcement. In this they were disappointed, but both the president and the vice-president clearly indicated that payment of dividends was now only a matter of perhaps three months. In a communication President De La Mar stated that the mill running last about 25,000 tons. Additions now being made to the mill would permit of increasing this to 30,000 tons a month in about 90 days' time, and that then the directors would have a fair knowledge of probably monthly returns and could declare a dividend which could be safely maintained.

Vice-president Edwards said he had no doubt that dividends would be paid in accordance with the president's letter. The Dome, he said, was in shape to pay dividends for many years, and on the sixth level some excellent ore had been encountered. Gold recovery was now being made to the extent of 94 per cent. Mr. Edwards also stated that the company was in good financial condition, and that only part of the proceeds of the new stock issues would be required for increasing the plant.

Mr. A. Scott and A. M. Curtis were elected to fill vacancies on the board caused by the resignation of Messrs. Marsh and Converse, otherwise the board was re-elected.
