Cattle—Prizes ruled from \$2 to \$8 per head, with the top prize for the best kind.

Oats—Steady, 200 bush selling at 30c to 31c. Hay and Straw—Steady, 30 loads of hay selling at \$17 to \$18 for old and \$19 to \$21 for new...
