of England always judge right, when rightly informed.) And as I now perceive, among the many villanous and diabolical Schemes, forg'd and made use of to inflame the People, and alienate their Affections from their Sovereign, the chimerical and black Infinuation, That our Prince has a greater Regard for his German than his British Dominions, and that these are subjected to the Measures of those: I thought the proving that Asfertion to be false and groundless, would be of the utmost Consequence towards quieting the Minds of Mankind, and cementing an happy Union between the King, the States, and the People; and it is for that Reafon I undertook to answer the Author of the Review of Germany, whole
