# AUTHORSHIP OF BIBLE

Paulist Father Gives the R. C. View of the Scriptures-Explanation of Prohibited Reading.

been the defender, the interpreter, the guardian of the Sacred Books. In the beginning of Christianity she was the first to gather the inspired writings together and to take measures to safe-guard their integrity. When men assailed the authority of these writings, when they perverted the original texts, she came forth as a teacher, and declared, in the name and with the infallible authority of Christ, her Founder-this is revelation; that is error; such and such books are inspired; others are mere human documents.

"We speak to-day of three things: irst, the concept of the church regarding the Bible; secondly, the use that Christ intended should be made of the sacred Scriptures; third, the difficulties presented by these sacred writings to those who would make them the sole origin of their belief. Regarding the first point, the Catholic Church claims that she alone has the right to determine what constitutes canon of the sacred books, those that have divine authorship. She declares that scholars may argue for or against the authenticity of certain books, that it is her place alone to de-cide which are and which are not to be the Bible. There was no New

accepted as such.

"There are seventy-odd books in the Old and New Testament that we regard as sacred and canonical. On the authority of the church we say these writings are inspired by the Holy Ghost. The word sacred used in connection with the Scriptures does not mean merely that they contain holy things, that they tell us of Christ and the prophets and so forth; that they embody beautiful moral teaching; but it means that these books we call 'sacred' have God for their author.

Divine Authorship. Divine Authorship.

The church never prohibited the reading of the Bible in the original text, the Hébrew-Caldaic, nor in the approved Latin Vulgate version. 
