STRIKE ON SILVER LEAF CAUSES SOME ACTIVITY

But Mining Markets are Generally Quiet—Criticism is Being Met by Reports.

World Office, Saturday Evening, June 15. The report of a strike on the Silver Leaf claim in the latter part of the week caused a slight stir in the mining markets and relieved the general gloom which has been present in practically the whole list.

The Foster directors are getting down to business in adopting a like policy in the matter of Green-Meehan and Foster. The Trethewey directors avoided anything of this nature by making public statements at certain stages in the history of this company and satisfying the indignities of those shareholders who are unable to visit the camp and see what is being done for themselves.

A statement of Green-Meehan was handed out during the meeting and although in appearing it tended to show that the property is being handled in a satisfactory way, a statement of the development of this claim has been the difficulty in obtaining proper machinery for the work.

Trading in the Cobalt securities at the present time is a very low ebb. Most shareholders have accepted the present level of prices without a great deal of concern, and appear to be satisfied to wait for a return to a better condition of affairs by a gradual development of the camp.

Professional operators are endeavoring to keep the market active by acquiring operations, but these are gradually dwindling by reason of a smaller liquidation from the outside public.
