DOES ESTRAANGED FROM FAMILY

Young Englishman's Death Reveals Sad Life Story of Thomas Fawcett, a Wanderer.

New York, April 8.—Death has revealed the life history of a young Englishman, Thomas C. Fawcett, civil and mechanical engineer, formerly a member of the firm of Thomas Fawcett & Co., limited, of London, England.

Fawcett's parents were wealthy, and he was highly educated, afterwards entering his father's employ. He quarreled with the son because of the reckless and wasteful life which the latter had led for several years.

In his father's will Thomas was only left an annuity of ten dollars a week, which he soon drew every week from a New York banking firm. If he failed to appear the allowance was forfeited.

He was seen to Melbourne, Australia, in the '80's to sit up a big plan there with machinery. He married in Melbourne, and secured a comfortable position at the office of a large railway company in Australia. This position, however, was wrecked by the loss of his wife, and for the last few years he has been unable to work on the allowance left him by his father.
