By 11 o'clock the judging was finished, and a start made with the parade. Starting from Queen's Park, the parade proceeded down University Avenue...

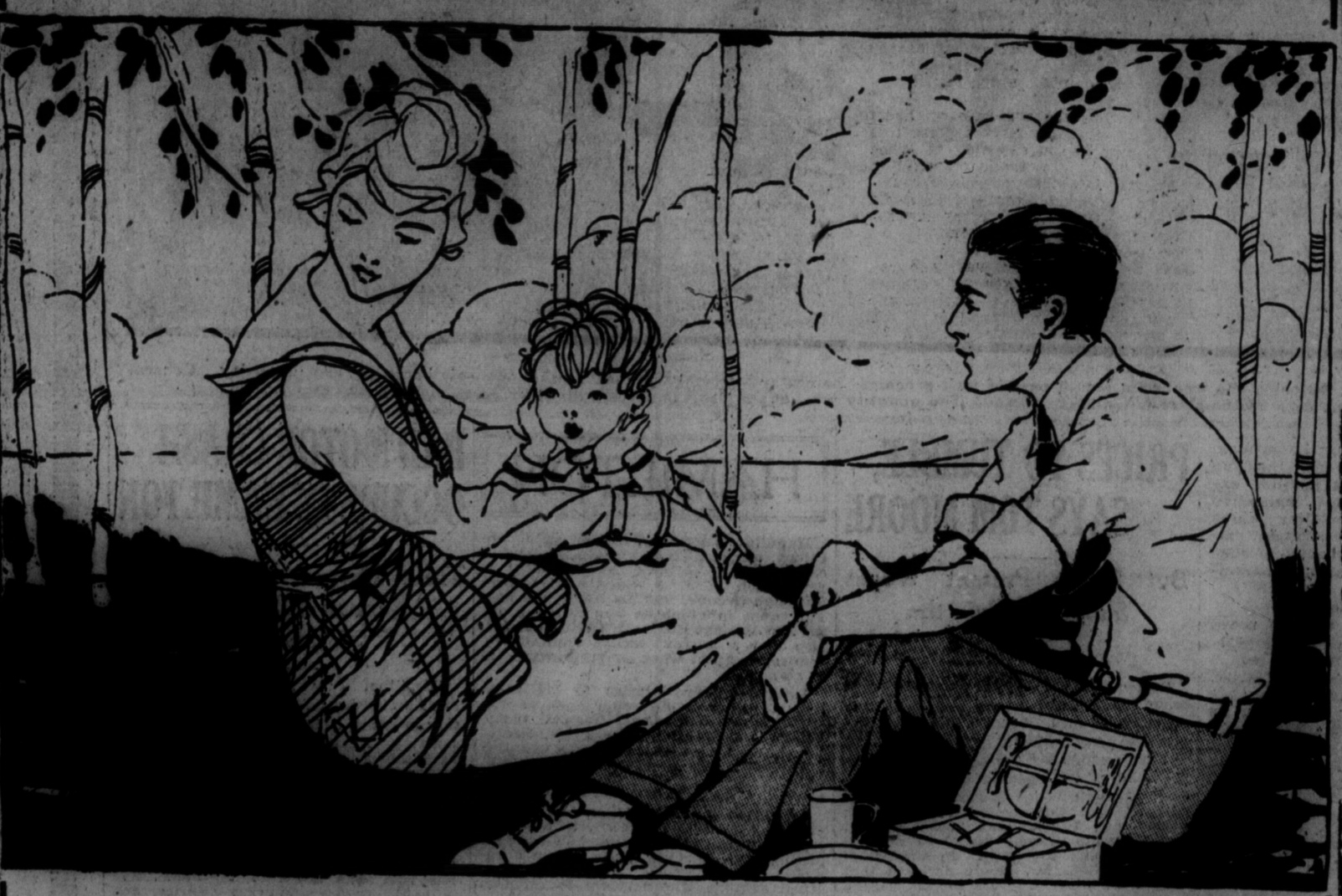
After the parade was over, the judges, executive officers of the association, and parade marshals were the guests of Col. Noel Marshall at luncheon in the National Club.

Just why this popular association was brought into existence, and still exists, is neatly put in the official program of yesterday's events. It reads as follows: 'The horses of all animals, in the most unfortunate, are subjected to painful diseases in the bones of the leg and foot. He is finely organized, and therefore suffers from rheumatism or cold. His teeth frequently require attention so that he can grind his food properly and get the full benefit of well-managed food. Little things most annoy and worry a horse, and if handled by a rough or brutal driver, he lives a state of perpetual misery. On the other hand, there are many humane owners and drivers who have a real affection for their horses and take the greatest pride in their appearance. It is, therefore, with the object of encouraging this kindness that this association has for the past seventeen years carried on the parade, and we believe that to some extent benefit has accrued.'
