LATER FROM EUROPE.—By packet ships at New York, we have received files of London and Liverpool papers to the 25th March.

The Weather and the Crops.—The weather has, during the past week, been the most favourable that could be desired for the country; the days have been bright and sunny, the temperature cold, but not severely so, whilst the slight frost which has prevailed during the night time, has benefited vegetation, by giving a wholesome check to the rank luxuriance which the previous warm weather had called forth.—Mark-lane Express.

RUSSIA.—Admission from Berlin of the 19th instants, that the Russian expedition against China was encountering many impediments in its march—the Khan having caused all the bridges over the numerous streams, canals and rivers which intersect the country, to be destroyed, and the Russian troops, with difficulty, proceeded the means of re-establishing the communications; and, being constantly harassed by the cavalry of the Uzbeks, their progress has of late been extremely slow.

Loss of Literature.—We repeat to learn from Rome that the fire in the library of the Roman College has been far more destructive than was at first apprehended. Upwards of 570 manuscripts have been destroyed, including treatises of Aristotle, Cicero, Ptolemy, nine Armenian, besides a collection of the Hindu and Chinese drama, all of which are unpublished, and some of the most valuable duplicates in Europe. The number of printed books consumed has not yet been ascertained, but 1500 volumes, belonging to the earliest days of printing, are unshakably included in this portion of the loss, as well as the valuable collection of Greek and Latin classics, bequeathed to the Roman College by the celebrated French philologist Muret, enriched by the autograph marginal notes of that illustrious scholar.
