



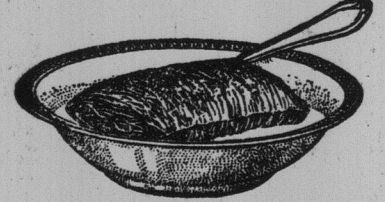
### Separation Allowance To Be Raised To \$25

Ottawa, Nov. 29.—An order-in-council has been passed in connection with the separation allowance paid to wives and other dependents of soldiers below the rank of sergeant in the Canadian expeditionary force from \$20 to \$25 per month, beginning Dec. 1. The effect of this is that in the month of January the wife or other dependent of every soldier hitherto in receipt of \$20 per month will receive \$25, the extra \$5 representing the increase for the two months of December and January and in each month thereafter she will receive \$25 instead of \$20. Checks for January will be issued earlier than usual.

The official announcement says: "This is in accordance with the policy which has been followed by the Union government and is another evidence of its desire to advance the welfare of the soldiers and their dependents in every way, consistent with sound national policy."

"A short time ago upon the recommendation of the minister of finance the government announced a substantial increase in the scale of pensions and this action was received throughout the country with every evidence of hearty approval. Veterans' Association, and by individuals to the effect that in view of the increased cost of living, an increased scale of separation allowance should be made. The government, having carefully considered all the circumstances and the financial considerations involved, reached the conclusion that the action proposed would afford needed assistance to the families of soldiers and that it was therefore in the public interest."

The above change will make the separation allowance payable to the wife or other dependent of a soldier below the rank of sergeant equal to that paid to the wife of a sergeant, and, on this account incidentally will remove what has been proved to be a fruitful source of trouble. In the past some confusion has inevitably resulted from frequent promotions to and reversions from the rank of sergeant as in each such change involved a change in the amount of separation allowance payable to the family concerned.

**ANARCHISTIC ITALIAN ORGANIZATION FORMED**  
PLOT TO CRIPPLE U. S.  
Seattle, Wn., Nov. 29.—Desire of the Circola Studi Sociali, an alleged pro-German-Italian anarchistic organization to cripple America's war plans, led it to distribute propaganda and send out agitators to give false warnings to American housewives that the enemy can food administration planned to seize their canned fruits, jellies and their stored foodstuffs. H. M. White, United States immigration commissioner, announced today. Mr. White directed recent raids in which more than seventy alleged members of the society were arrested.

The task of endeavoring to undermine the food administration's work was but one of many undertaken by the members in their efforts to aid Germany, federal officials say. Other steps included an assassination of King Emmanuel of Italy, seizure of foodstuffs in the United States and spreading of disinformation both in the ranks of the Italian army and throughout the United States.

### RESCUED BY A ST. JOHN MAN

Wm. Martin Saves Roy McMillan of Vancouver, Adrift, Helpless, in Storm on Queen Charlotte Sound

The following account of a heroic rescue by a St. John man is quoted from a Vancouver province of October 12:—"Roy McMillan of Vancouver had a remarkable escape from being drowned in Queen Charlotte Sound two weeks ago. He started for home from Prince Rupert, where he had been fishing all summer, in a thirty-foot gasoline launch. After leaving Calvert Island the sea was running so that he could not turn to go back, so he ran between Table Island and the mainland looking for shelter, but finding none decided to make for Shushartle Bay. When near Cape Caution his engine broke down and his boat was driven on the rocks, smashing his propeller and steering gear. Having lost his small boat, and with his launch rapidly filling with water, he drifted helplessly. With a heavy southeast wind blowing him out to sea, he gave up in despair. After drifting for hours he was observed by William Martin, light-keeper on Egg Island, who tried to launch a boat to go to his assistance. After having his boat overturned several times, Martin succeeded in getting his boat out. His wife watching, at times could see neither boat. But, fortunately, he reached Mr. McMillan and both got safely back to Egg Island, where Mr. McMillan has since been because it has been impossible to launch a small boat."

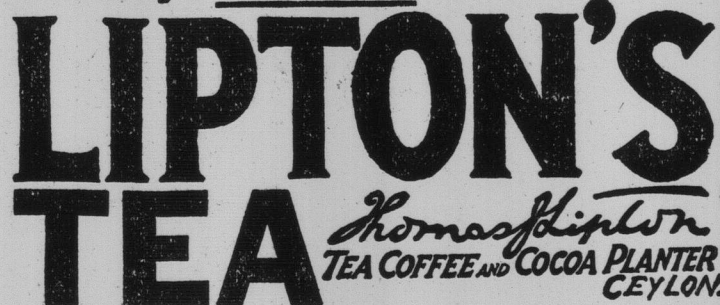

### VICTORY LOAN FIGURES

Kingston, Ont., Nov. 29.—The Victory Loan campaign has reached and passed the second objective and this morning it was announced that \$2,022,280 had been subscribed. Yesterday's subscription totalled \$342,800. One in nine of the city's population have subscribed.

**Saskatoon Reaches Mark.**  
Saskatoon, Sask., Nov. 29.—The Saskatoon district will attain its allotment in the Victory Loan campaign. Up to last night the figures stood \$5,004,000. The city is only \$4,000 short of its allotment.

Calgary, Alta., Nov. 29.—Southern Alberta has reached its quota on the Victory Loan, according to the official figures given out at the headquarters today. The allotment for the twelve divisions was \$7,000,000 and the figures up to last night stood at \$7,088,700. Calgary city is now over the \$3,000,000 mark.

Manitoba Near to \$20,000,000.  
Winnipeg, Nov. 29.—Manitoba's Victory Loan subscriptions today totalled \$19,441,250.

Rely on Bread and Potatoes.  
Amsterdam, Nov. 29.—Speaking in the Prussian lower house today on food conditions, Herr Von Walldow, president of the German food regulation board, said: "Considerable supplies of grain for making bread have been provided by early threshing. The imperial grain bureau has already received 1,000,850

tons, as compared with 880,000 tons last year. The potato crop may be regarded as satisfactory—almost as a good one, and we count upon having 34,500,000 tons. Distribution will be carried out much more efficiently than in recent years. The same quantity of sugar as formerly can be delivered. We shall still have to bear many restrictions, but we have adequate food supplies for the new year. Herr Von Walldow said that bread and potatoes would form the basis of the food supply.

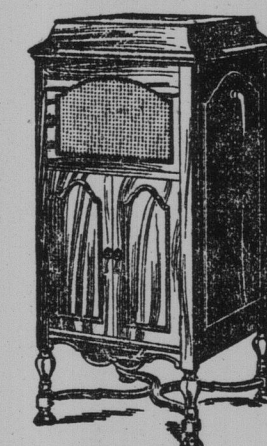
