MORNING WAR NOTES

Several transports with troops aboard Italian ports last night for an unknown destination. It is thought they are being sent to Turkey.

The Turkish ambassador in Rome and the Italian ambassador in Constantinople have both left for their respective countries.

Serbia is said to have yielded to Italy in regard to her demands as to Albania, thus smoothing one of the difficulties in the Balkan problem.

British, By Bold Stroke, Win in Dardanelles

Smashing Victory, Which Has Cut The Turkish Lines of Communication For Supplies of Ammunition and Food—Surprise That Ensures Capture of Constantinople

(Special cable to Toronto Daily Star and Chicago Daily News by Louis Edgar Brown)

Mudros, Dardanelles, Base of Allies, Aug. 20 (via Athens)—The demoralization and surrender of the Turkish army defending the Gallipoli Peninsula is predicted for the near future. The opening of the Dardanelles and the eventual fall of Constantinople is now declared inevitable. Minor military difficulties probably will prevent the allies reaching Constantinople before spring, but the startling results of the latest British military achievement eclipsing anything of a similar nature in history, assure the allies of full eventual victory over the Turks and leads to the belief that the European side of the Dardanelles French forces later withdrew to the ships British Forces Form Junction

In the morning the British made a violent night attack, putting the enemy entirely to rout with terrific loss. The Australian and New Zealand forces holding the territory north of Gaba Tepe, who had been heavily engaged for four days, concentrated simultaneously on the left junction and captured the Australians with the British invading forces, so that they now had a continuous line twelve miles long twice cutting the main road which the Turks defending the peninsula needed as supplies.

The British forces held the villages of Buayk-Hanafar and Turcher-Ken through which the road passed. There is another road, but it is only a mile path over the mountains.

This is the Dardanelles Road British Seize Dardanelles Road

The British held the direct artillery which can sweep the valley of Bolkalidze clear to the waters of the Dardanelles. The battery is continually trained on this road. Every three minutes during the night shells exploded over the road.

Wounded men described to me the battlefield as a horrible sight. Hundreds of bodies, equipment and stores. One man described the funeral pyres. At intervals of ten minutes the bodies of the dead were carried out and thrown into the sea. The bodies were immediately to prevent disease when there are insufficient men to bury the dead.

The British having broken the land communication, it remains for the navy to destroy the waterway lines. These already have been disrupted by submarines which control the lower part of the set of Marone. These recent sink 100 sailing boats and not enough were left to even transport Turkish supplies across the Dardanelles for 10,000 men. The losses in the battle were British 4,000 dead, 9,000 wounded.
