Yankees Continue To Win Despite Absence of Stars

Indians Beat Senators

Rain Again Interferes With Chicago-Philadelphia Game; Brooklyn Looks Good For National League Pennant; Giants Need Pitchers

Despite a badly crippled team, the Yankees are gaining in the American League race. Two in a row from Detroit is going some, with "Home Run" Baker, Gilhouse and Maisei out of the line-up.

The Indians at last won a game from Washington, making the third victory over the Senators since the beginning of the season. Tom Daly, who caught for Cleveland during the last week, was one of the three Indians to get safeties off Johnson on last Saturday.
