ROSS RIFLE PLANI AGAIN DUUBLED TO

Quebec, Feb. 4—The Ross rifle factory has contracted to furnish to the Russian government 8,000,000 rifles during the next two years. It will also supply to England and Canada 500 rifles a day simuultaneously. The plant, which has already been doubled since the outbreak of the war will be doubled again before November, when it is expected that some five thousand men will be given employment. Representatives of the factory have announced to the city council their intention to bring over some 1200 expert hands from Europe, Belgium in particular.
