MONTREAL, Nov. 26-The local stock market was quite strong at its opening this morning, but activity was mainly confined to a few of the leaders. National Breweries was the most active issue, with a turnover of a thousand shares and touched a new high for the current movement, at 53, up 3-4, later easing fractionally. Next to Breweries came Consolidated Smelt-2rs, which rose 2½ to 153½ in fairly heavy trading. It receded ½, however, in the first 12 minutes. The other leader was Brazilian, which gained ½ to 753-4. Atlantic Sugar was firm at 321-8, up 5-8, as was also Abitibi at 69, up 3-4, and St. Maurice Paper at 103½, up the fraction. The only other stocks to put in an appearance, were Dominion Textile, which sold unchanged at 88, and Empire Steel common, also the same at 23-4. stock market was quite strong at its
