MARKET STRONG IN MONTREAL AT OPENING

Activity, However, Is Confined to Few of Leading Issues

MONTREAL, Nov. 26.—The local stock market was quite strong at its opening this morning, but activity was mainly confined to a few of the leaders. National Breweries was the most active issue, with a turnover of a thousand shares and touched a new high for the current movement, at 53, up 8-4, later easing fractionally. Next to Breweries came Consolidated Smelters, which rose 2 1/2 to 183 1/2, in fairly heavy trading. It receded 1/2, however, in the first 12 minutes. The other leader was Brazilian, which gained 1/2 to 75 3/4. Atlantic Sugar was firm at 32 1/8, up 3-4, as was also Abitibi at 69, up 3-4, and St. Maurice Paper at 109 1/2, up the fraction. The only other stocks to put in an appearance, were Dominion Textile, which sold unchanged at 86, and Empire Steel common, also the same at 23-4.
