Councillor W. Murray Campbell and Councillor John T. O'Brien conferred with Premier Veniot and B. M. Hill, provincial road engineer, yesterday with respect to proposed improvements on the roadway leading to the western end of the highway bridge at the Reversing Falls. The co-operation of the Provincial Government will be required in this programme which has been proposed by the Lancaster Highway Board. Briefly, it is proposed to widen the road at this section by taking down the retaining wall of the Provincial Hospital grounds, running along the street railway tracks and excavating a portion of the land of the hospital.

The roadway at this section is narrow. As motor traffic has increased considerably and as this is the western entry to the city, it was deemed advisable to lay these proposals before the government, which has promised consideration of the matter.

A reduction of one cent a gallon in some gasoline prices became effective in St. John yesterday.


Montreal, July 18—Retail gasoline prices in Montreal today were 31 and 34 cents plux tax. This is a reduction from the 32 and 35.


