Probation And Parole.

The report of the committee was endorsed by the board of the Prisoners' Welfare Association as a whole, and in considering its recommendation seriatim, special emphasis was laid upon certain sections which would naturally appeal to such a body. The extension of the probation system in the criminal courts and of the parole system for those in penal institutions, it was contended by C. P. W. A. members, forms the essential framework of any reforms in the treatment of offenders against the law; hence they readily approved the recommendations of the Bar Association's committee that a probation act should be passed in each province, also an Extra Mural Act, and that the system of parole in each province should be established as apart from the Dominion system already operating.

Another recommendation was to the

Another recommendation was to the effect that there should be an act to provide a Public Defender in criminal cases, thought this had not been agreed upon by a majority vote and had therefore been sent on for consideration of the association. The C. P. W. A. expressed the hope that this project would commend itself to the profession as the need for such an offer was very evident according to their experience.
