

Declares Assessment is 25 Per Cent. Higher Than Building Would Sell For—City to File Accounts.

New York, June 28.—Figures on the value of the Woolworth building and the income received from it were filed in the Supreme Court when the Broadway Park Place Company, owner of the building, got an order from Justice Marsh compelling the Commissioners of Taxes and Assessment to file in court a record of their proceedings finding that the total value of the property for the present year is \$12,500,000, and that the land alone is worth \$3,850,000. The complaint asserts that the total value of the property is not more than \$10,000,000, of which \$7,000,000 is the value of the building and sa,8000,000 that of the land.

The petition of the owner assert that the building is assessed for 25 per cent. more than it would be sold for at the present time, whereas the general custom is to assess for taxation purposes at less than the market value. The assessment on the land is alleged to be 67 per cent. more than the first assessment in 1911, although there has been a steady decline since in the value of realty. Under the rulings of the Federal taxation bureaus there would be an allowance of 17 per cent., or \$1,800,000, for depreciation.
