Barnesville, N. B., Dec. 2—The death of Miss Phoebe Hosford occurred at her parents' home, Barnesville (N. B.), at an early hour on Nov. 29, due to an attack of influenza. She was only twenty-two years of age. Madrid, Dec. 3—The Spanish ministry resigned today.

The cabinet which has just resigned was headed by the Marquis de Alhueemas, a Liberal and friend of the Allies, with Count Romanones as foreign minister. He took office on November 17, in succession to a coalition cabinet under Antonio Maura, in which both Alhueemas and Romanones held portfolios. The Maura cabinet took office last spring succeeding one under the premiership of the Marquis de Alhueemas.
