The annual meeting of the St. John Horticultural Association was opened this afternoon.

The managing committee reported as follows:—

In consequence of the great increase in wages the funds available for the use of the association were found during the past year to be entirely inadequate for the efficient upkeep of the park and gardens. The roads in the park were consequently not maintained to the same extent as formerly and it was found impossible to keep the gardens up to the usual standard. This having been recently fully represented to the mayor and commissioners they readily acquiesced in the association's request and have prom-

Besides the outstanding debentures of \$7,000, there is an overdraft in the bank which of necessity must be reduced. This was accomplished to the extent of \$421.54, the overdraft now stands at \$3,180.70.

Your committee regret to have to report that Charles T. Merritt, who had occupied the octagonal house and who had the privileges of Lily Lake, recently died. His family are about moving away.

Your committee are negotiating for the carrying on of the lake attractions in summer and on a more extensive plan. This will necessitate the construction of a more suitable building, the whole cost of which it is hoped will not fall on the association.

Joseph Tebo, with his wife, has carried on the restaurant in the tea house in a most satisfactory manner. He has this year provided a number of toboggans for hire, at a reasonable rate, on the slide.

During the summer years were for the first time employed in the gardens in weeding and other light work.

Lack of funds has prevented the addition by purchase to the attraction of the Zoo. The two older bears were sold and a young pair bought, the latter being more attractive and, for the present, of less consuming capacity.
