TWO FAMOUS NAMES.

"Jack Tar" as a nickname for a sailor is first recorded in 1788, but sailors were known as "tars" for more than a hundred years before that. The name already appears in literature in the latter half of the seventeenth century. "Tar" may be short for "tarpaulin." Sailors were called "tarpaulins" early in the eighteenth century. Tarpaulin, of course, is canvas, tarred to make it waterproof, and the sailors' hat made of that material, something like a sou'-wester, is called a tarpaulin. However, that may be, British sailors have been "hon-tars," "jolly tars," and "gallant tars" or two hundred years.
