The announcement that the C. P. R. has agreed to build forthwith the line from Fredericton to Minto, thus connecting the Central Railway with the capital, is contained in a despatch from Ottawa. No further details are given, and William Downie, superintendent of the Atlantic Division of the C. P. R., said this morning that he had no information on the subject.

It is understood by those in touch with the matter, that this means that the branch will be built by the company headed by Sir Thomas Tait, which recently took over the charter of the Minto & Fredericton Railway. This charter was secured by some of the prominent residents of the district simply for the purpose of advancing the project, with the understanding that they would turn it over to any bona fide company which would undertake the work of construction. The owners of the charter are said to have received only a few hundred dollars each, merely enough to cover the expenses incurred in connection with it.


