

The mysterious leak which caused the loss of water supply on all the higher levels in the city from early Saturday | morning was not discovered until Sunday morning. The search had been main-tained steadily, day and night, until the break was located in the fifteen inch main in Brussels street, near Hanover. Repairs were completed and the service restored to normal by eight o'clock last evening.
