THE GEN OF THE ATLANTIC.
Beautiful View at Pictou--Brough Northumberland Strait--The Emerald Isle of the Dominion--Interview with Governor Macdonald and Premier Sullivan.
He who has not stood upon the hill at Pictou on a clear summer's day and overlooked city, bay and opposite shore, has missed one of the most pleasing views of the most beautiful of the maritime provinces. The bay, its surface sparkling in the sunshine and dotted with sail-boats, extends to the right and almost to the center of the peninsula; away to the left it widens into Northumberland Strait, while the opposite shore rises in some places abrupt and rocky, and in others slopes so gently to the water's edge that at high tide the emerald tints of the bay, and the white salt surf. All the commanding knolls on each side are crowned with pretty residences, over all is the deep blue sky, and there is just warm enough to be deliciously balmy.
When, therefore, the great gliding steamer moved out at 1 p. m. over a harbor surface smooth and glassy as that of an unruffled lake we naturally anticipated "a love of a ride" to Charlottetown. Down the harbor the shores on both sides gradually lowered till they were level with the water, and the rocky shores of Cape Breton to the east. And the water was steadily rising.
We had a splendid party aboard. There was a little group of tourists from Massachusetts who had just made the rounds of Cape Breton Island and were in their prime of life and vigor. There were also a few fine Prince Edward Islanders going home from the Halifax summer carnival, smiling gravely in the manner of the proverbial Yankee opinions, but reserving their own.
