PHILADELIPHTA, Feb. 26. — Only survivor of a family that had been all but obliterated by one of the most sensational and bloody murders in the history of American crime, William C. Deering died Wednesday night in the Presbyterian Hospital, after a life during which he had tried constantly to avoid the gloomy notoriety that fol-lowed upon the tragedy of his boy-hood. 
