SIGNAL SERVICE BULETIN.

The Manchester Importer from Man-chester via Halifax, arrived last night and will discharge cargo at the I. C. R. pier.

VESSEL WAS BEACHED.

Vineyard Haven, Mass., Dec. 13.— Schr American Team, South Amboy, for Castine, Me., with coal, was beached in a leaky condition by revenue cutter Acushnet to prevent sinking, storms of the last few days having opened her seams.

The Elder Dempster steamer Kwarra, Capt. Davies, the first boat of the South African service, reached St John Saturday from Shields in ballas to load for Capetown and other South African ports. J. T. Knight & Co., archer agents. The ship was 16 days of the voyage out and experienced some very rough weather.

NEW LAW FOR OWNERS.

Ottawa, Dec. 13.—The government is being flooded with letters from relatives of those who lost their lives in the recent lake storm. They urge more stringent laws of inland water protection. It is especially insisted that it be made an offence for the owner of a vessel to require his captain to leave port when storm signals are up.

Legislation will probably be brought down by the government.

Providence, R. I., Dec. 13.—Barge Francis S. Hampshire broke away from tug Scully in a heavy gale off Block Island early yesterday and is supposed to have foundered. Those on board were Capt. Liljander, Walter Billups and Frank Sorensen. Barge Henry Falling, which the Scully also had in tow, sprung a leak and was towed to Newport and later brought here.

MARINE DISASTERS.

London, Der 12.—Stmr Bridgeport (Br), from Syuney, C. B., Nov. 1 for Montreal, has been posted at Lloyds as missing.

Stmr Baron Dalmeny (Br), Haye, from Bombay Oct. 25 for Philadelphia, put into Bermuda Dec. 8 for coal.

Schr Francis (of St. Johns, Nfid.), was abandoned at sea Nov. 28. All on board saved and landed at Calais.

HAD STORMY WEATHER.

The Lunenburg schooner Oregon, Capt. Eisenhouse, arrived Saturday from Barbados with a cargo of molasses for Messrs. Jones & Schoffeld. The schooner was 23 days coming up. She had a good deal of stormy weather, and during the late heavy blow she sought shelter in Vineyard Haven.

DISMASTED AND DESERTED.

San Francisco, Cal., Dec. 10.—Dismasted and deserted, ship Dalgonar (Br), from Callao for Taltal, Chili, was sighted Oct. 28 about 1,200 miles west of the coast of Chili by bark Marie (Fr), which arrived here today from Liverpool. The Dalgonar probably carried as many as 30 men. Two of her small boats were missing. The cargo had shifted and she was lying almost on her beam ends. Her papers were missing.


