## MARITIME MISCELLANY.

Mobile, Ala., June 2.—Stmr Napier (Br), which arrived here May 31 from Pensacola, is being at her pier with fire in her coal bunkers; the fire is under control.

Norfolk, Va., June 2.—Stmr Westons (Ger), from Savannah for Antwerp, sprung a leak while outbound from Norfolk late Monday afternoon. She was brought to Norfolk and beached at Lamberts Point. The leak has been located in a breakage of the hull bottom. The vessel is expected to steam for Antwerp 2d.

## SHIPPING NOTES.

Donaldson Line S. S. Indra, Capt. Telfer, from Glasgow, with general cargo, and the S. S. Thorold, Capt. Iverson, from Grangemouth, to load cargo, arrived Wednesday. The vessels passed much ice. The Indra on May 31, from 4 a. m. to 11 a. m. passed 24 bergs. In three hours sighted and passed 17 very large bergs. The Indra made the passage from Glasgow in eleven days and six hours and tied up at McAleer's wharf. The Thorold encountered rough weather coming across, and 180 miles south of Cape Race numerous icebergs and growlers were passed.

The new Cunard liner which is building at Wallsend is to be named Aurania. She will be an intermediate steamer, somewhat larger than the Andania and Alaunia. She is intended for the company's London-Canadian service.

Schooner Susan N. Pickering is now on her way to New York with a very unusual cargo, it consisting of an immense granite fountain bowl, said to be the largest in the world, which is destined for John D. Rockefeller's country home at Tarrytown on the Hudson. In its rough state it weighed over 200 tons. It is 20 feet and eight inches in diameter, and three feet four inches deep. The fountain is insured for \$10,000 and the freight is \$700.

Portland Argus: The dullness in freights, so noticeable at the present time, is not confined to the largest vessels, engaging in the carrying of coal, but includes the three-masted schooners which at this season of the year are usually kept busy in transporting lumber, stone and ice from eastern ports to Boston and New York. Some of the coasting captains who were in the city Tuesday were complaining bitterly that it was exceedingly difficult to find profitable employment for their vessels at the present time. Stone freights, they claimed, were very scarce with rates low, while but few lumber freights are offering, and these mostly at Canadian ports. A quiet summer is looked for in the shipping business, but conditions are expected to improve in all directions in the fall.

S. S. Splishy, Captain Goldworthy, sailed yesterday from Grindstone Island for Manchester, with a cargo of deer.

The Norwegian barque Don, Capt. Adamsen, 1,070 tons register, arrived yesterday from New York to load cargo for U. K. by John E. Moore & Co.

## DANGERS TO NAVIGATION.

Stmr Kroonland from Antwerp, reports May 30, lat 41 12, lon 55 53, passed a broken spar standing 6 feet out of water, apparently attached to sunken wreckage.

Stmr Grosser Kurierst (Ger), reports June 1, lat 41 02, lon 66 17, spoke stmr Dalharna (Br), which reported ice in lat 42 46, lon 47 55.

Stmr Perslan reports May 29, Shinnecock light bearing NW by W 1/2 W, about 10 1/2 miles distant, passed a large spar projecting about 10 feet out of water, apparently attached to submerged wreckage.

Stmr Victoria (Br), reports May 27, about 10 miles E of Fire Island Lightship saw a canopy of wreckage consisting of small wood boxes, etc.

Stmr Star of Australia (Br), reports May 27, lat 40 28N, lon 73 24 W, passed a large spar standing upright and apparently attached to submerged wreckage.

Stmr El Sud reports May 27, lat 22 20 S, lon 72 20 W, passed what appeared to be a vessel's topmast 10 to 12 inches in diameter standing upright and projecting about 10 feet out of water, apparently attached to submerged wreckage.

Stmr Alamo reports May 31, lat 28 46 N, lon 72 16 W, passed a first class canoe buoy with red and black horizontal stripes in good order.

U. S. stmr Jovett reports May 27, about 15 miles 220 deg (true) from end of South Jetty, Galveston, saw a derelict wreck, probably a schooner's hull with deck beams gone; frames and planking showing for about 25 feet.

Stmr Excelsior (Ger) reports May 22, lat 41 18 N, lon 45 50 W, saw a beam standing upright and projecting about 5 feet out of water.

Stmr Touraine (Fr), reports May 21, lat 41 39, lon 48 30, used two small icebergs and several growlers.

Stmr Eagle Point (Br), radiographed that on May 21, lat 42 32, lon 49 44, passed numerous large icebergs and growlers stretching for 30 miles to eastward.

Stmr Excelsior reports May 22, lat 41 18, lon 48 06, saw a large iceberg about 45 meters high; lat 41 18, lon 48 11, a large berg about 30 meters high; lat 41 24, lon 48 13, a large berg about 60 meters high, and lat 41 18, lon 48 29, a large berg about 50 meters high.

Stmr Victoria (Br), reports May 23, lat 41 22, lon 48 12, saw a large iceberg, and lat 41 22, lon 48 22, a large berg.

U. S. revenue cutter Seneca radiographed as follows June 2.—Stmr Imperator (Ger), reports June 1, 6 a. m. lat 40, lon 58 20; stmr San Francisco (Br), reports same date, 8 a. m., 4 bergs near lat 41 26, lon 48 30; position, lat 41 16, lon 48 45.
