AMERICAN VESSEL

IS TORPEDOED

Steamer Suruga Compelled to
Run Ashore in Mediterran-
ean—Crew Safe.New York, Jan. 5.—The American
steamship Suruga, a vessel of 4437
tons gross register, and owned by the
New York and Oriental Steamship Co.,
was torpedoed and compelled to run
ashore on December 27, while in Med-
iterranean waters, according to a report
received here today in insurance
circles.The Suruga left New York the latter
part of October for an Italian port,
and it is understood she was return-
ing and bound for a French port when
torpedoed. So far as can be learned
here her crew are all safe.

NO SEPARATE PEACE

FOR THE JAPANESE

No Matter How Advantageous
the Offer Japan Will Reject
it and Continue With Allies.Mexico City, Jan. 6.—If the enemy
proposes a separate peace, no matter
how advantageous, Japan will reject it,
Baron Puglatore Otori, the new Japa-
nese minister to Mexico, declared to-
day in a statement concerning the atti-
tude of his country. Japan, he said,
could remain on the side of the allies
and was co-operating in the war to her
full extent. Being one of the signa-
tories of the treaty of London, Japan,
the minister added, would not look
upon that treaty as a scrap of paper.

GERMANS EXECUTE

TWENTY-TWO MEN

Espionage Was the Charge
Against Them—Others Sen-
tenced to Imprisonment.Amsterdam, Jan. 5.—Twenty-two per-
sons, among them four from Antwerp,
eight from Ghent and a Dutch skipper,
were executed at Ghent December 30,
for alleged espionage according to the
Telegraph's correspondent at Flushing.
Three other Hollanders were con-
demned to three, four and ten
years imprisonment, respectively. A
large number of Belgians also received
long terms of imprisonment and many
others still are incarcerated at Ghent
awaiting trial.
