Hostel Committee Met Yesterday

Steward Had To Leave The Ship

Was So Run-down He Had To Lay Off - Is Wonderfully Built Up By Tanlac.

Ratified Action in Agreeing to Take Salvation Army Metropole for Hostel - Other Business Transacted.

The report of the committee appointed to find a suitable building for a hostel was heard at a meeting of the Hostel Committee held yesterday afternoon in the Board of Trade rooms, Mrs. J. B. Travers presiding.

Mrs. H. Lawrence handed in her report which explained that the Salvation Army Metropole on Bevin street was the only building which would answer the purpose, and in many ways it was a most conveniently situated and fitted up. The rental was \$600 a year. Those present ratified the action of the committee in agreeing to take this place, and Mrs. Lawrence and Mrs. J. B. Travers warmly thanked, on motion of Mr. Goldman, for their work in searching for a building.

The Army has begun making the building ready for use of the hostel board. A matron and a cook will be engaged to operate the hostel, and it has been suggested that since the food service is to be in cafeteria style guests of the hostel can help out.

The Dominion Government has granted \$500 a year towards maintenance of the institution, in addition to allowing \$1.50 per girl for 48 hours' keep; the provincial government has promised financial assistance, and with support from the public here, it is hoped to be able to conduct the hostel in a manner which will be in keeping with the reputation and importance of the port.

The British street structure will accommodate from 20 to 30 girls, and there is a total accommodation available in the city for upwards of 40 girls. The accommodation is expected to be ample. Arrangements are being made to have the government place in the office of the civil establishment commission a girl who will look after the applications for domestics and who will arrange with the hostel committee for the supply.

A budget of the hostel for equipment and upkeep of the Hostel was submitted by Mrs. Travers and approved by the Provincial Committee representing all the Women's societies of the city. This budget will be forwarded to Ottawa.

There was some discussion as to the power of the present committee and it was decided to report progress at the next meeting of the Women's Council when further steps towards the organization of a permanent society will probably be taken.

Y. W. C. A. Board Of Directors Meet

Month of Activity Was Reported at Session Yesterday - There Are Now 729 Members of Association, 155 Sustaining Members.

A month of activity was reported at the meeting of the Board of Directors of the Young Women's Christian Association held yesterday at the rooms of the association, Mrs. J. B. Travers presiding and Mrs. Alfred Morrissey acting as secretary.

The devoted reading was given by Mrs. R. C. Elin. It was on prayer and was very helpful. The Travelers Aid report stated that this had been a very quiet month only 117 meals having been served and 147 beds occupied.

The house committee's report, given by Mrs. J. A. McArthur, stated that there are twenty-four girls now at the month. Mrs. J. A. McArthur had been the speaker at one and Miss Frances Jones at others. A Halloween party had been thoroughly enjoyed and a shower party held for a member of the Cafeteria staff who was leaving to be married. The House committee has given a Book Show for the girls providing a number of interesting books. The evening was spent in games of cards, table tennis and cake served by the committee.

Those present had expressed their appreciation of the entertainment.

It had been decided to lower the price of some of the rooms.

It is hoped that the opening of the new gymnasium on King street, East, will take place shortly and when this is completed it is expected that the association will be able to carry on a number of interesting projects. Miss Mathison the House Secretary spoke yesterday afternoon of some of the plans. There are now 729 members of the Y. W. C. A. of which 155 are sustaining members.

COMMON COUNCIL MET IN COMMITTEE

Harbor Commission Matter Will be Dealt With Today - Water and Sewerage Estimate Increased - Granite Block Paving.

It was said in the committee meeting of the Common Council yesterday morning that before the matter of harbor commission is submitted to a plebiscite by the electors, the act will have to be agreed to by a vote of four of the five commissioners. The matter will be taken up at 2:30 this afternoon before the Council meeting.

The estimate for sewerage work in Douglas avenue was increased by \$200, and the estimate for the water main decreased a like amount. This was done on account of the necessity for a larger sewer pipe than that planned.

In answer to Commissioner Fisher, the city engineer said that the estimate was ample to cover restoration of the street as far as could be done at present.
