STEAMSHIPS RAN ERRATIC COURSE

Montreal, May 6.—In today's trading on the local stock market, Dominion Steel Corporation and Brompton Paper led the market with sales of 2995 and 2450 shares respectively. Each rose 1½ points to 72 and 66½.

Among the so-called merger stocks, Steamships was somewhat erratic, selling from 75½ to 77; the preferred closed at a net gain of a fraction. A small lot of Porgins sold at 235, equal to a net loss of four points.

Stronger stocks took in Atlantic Sugar, which rose 3½ points to 91½; National Breweries up 1½ points to 21½ and Dominion Glass which gained a fraction. Waynasmack sold up 2 points to 90.

Merchants Bank lost 1½ points at 200½.

DIED ON TUESDAY AFTER BRIEF ILLNESS

Many Friends Mourn the Death of Charles Parker Baker of Fairville Which Occurred Tuesday at Waterton, Mass.

The death of Charles Parker Baker, formerly head of the firm of Randolph Baker, took place at Waterton, Mass., on Tuesday, after a brief illness of pneumonia. Mr. Baker left his home in Fairville about eight days ago to visit friends in the States. The remains will be brought here today, and the funeral will take place on Sunday next. His wife, who was Miss Amanda Shaw, daughter of John Shaw, of Augusta, Maine, died in February, 1919. Rev. George Baker, who recently resigned the pastorate of an Ithaca, N. Y., Baptist church, to do organizational work for the Baptist denomination

in New York city, is a son, and there is one grandchild, Ernest Baker. Two children pre-deceased Mr. Baker, Charles F. Baker and Miss Ada Baker. Two brothers and a sister survive: B. C. Baker, of Halifax; Miss Emma Baker and P. P. Baker, of this city.

Mr. Baker was born at Fairville and lived practically all his life in Lancashire, St. John. He was a member of the firm of Randolph Baker, lumber mill owners until five years ago, when he retired. He was a prominent member of the Fairville Baptist church and of the Masonic Order.

Although over eighty years of age he had never been ill since childhood. No man was more highly respected in the community. During a long, active

progressive and successful business career, he was always cheerful and optimistic, and it was a pleasure to meet and converse with him. His death will be sincerely mourned.
