Please, please, please don't make this a solo portrait.

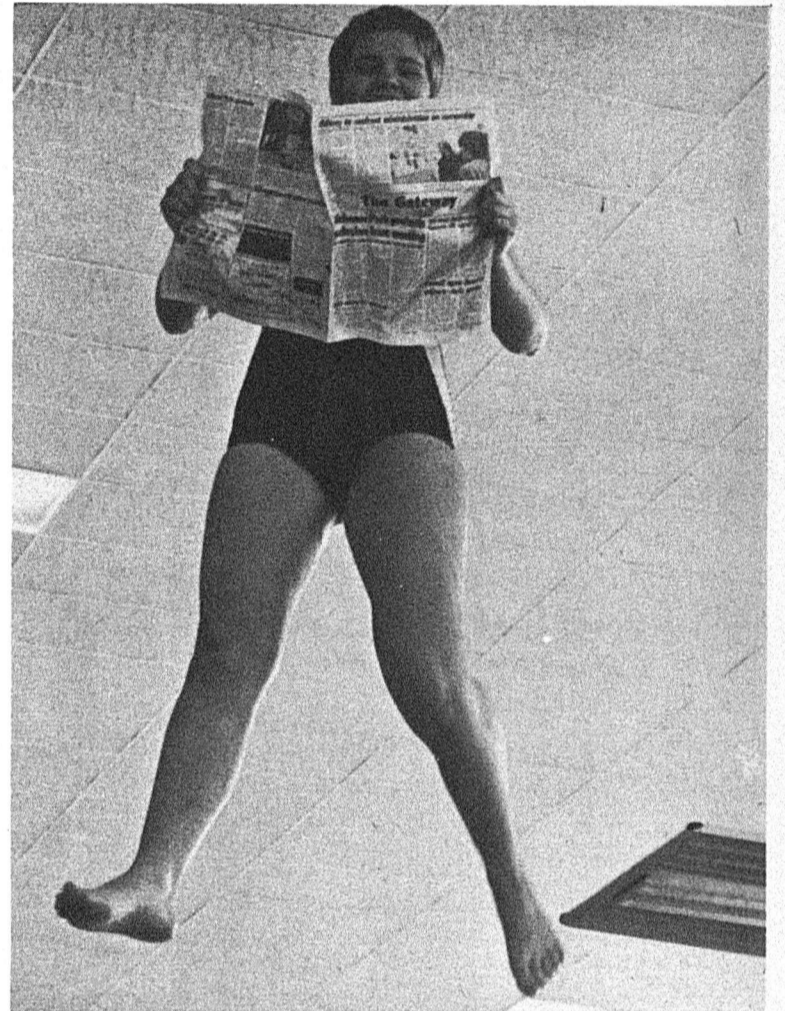
