due to causes difficult to escertain and enumerate.

Principals differ as to the quantity of certain foods
necessary for the proper nourishment of children. It is
evident that the late Principal McLeod used much less
beef than is at present consumed and much less than is
provided for in the dietary table. Principal Sinclair
considered that a larger ration of beef was necessary,
and he states that he was urged by the late Inspector
McGibbon to give the pupils a generous beef diet.

The undersigned would not assume the responsibility of laying down any rule as to the quantities of staple foods which should be given to Indian children, who it is well known have a tendency to tuberculosis, the overcoming of which demands an ample and nutritious diet.

In inquiring as to the basis upon which a per capita grant of \$130.00 per annum was fixed the undersigned have discovered an estimate prepared by an official of the Department as to the probable cost of maintaining at the Regina Industrial School 100 pupils. He estimated the total cost per annum at \$13,450. made

up as follows:-Food for 100 \$2,600.00 per annum Pupils at \$26.00 Clothing for pupils at 2,700,00 \$27.00 each 572.00 Food for 11 officials Food contingencies -sick fare, 328,00 visitors, &c. 1,550.00 Heating & Lighting 300,00 Medical Attendance Stationery, School material, 700.00 & Contingencies
