I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 19th instant, enclosing voucher No. 24 amounting to \$ 32.55, and also a statement of expenditure in connection with the journey which you and three Indian Chiefs made to Ottawa for the purpose of arriving at a settlement relative to the surrender to The Calgary Power Company of certain lands, on the Stony Reserve; and in reply I beg to return herewith the statement in question. It should be made out in duplicate, and you should obtain receipts from the Indians of the amounts charged as advances to them, viz:-

May 22nd advance to Indians .....	\$33.00
" 19th " " " on train	15.00
" " " " " at Ottawa	60.00

	for return 15.00
	\$ 123.00

As all the Indians can sign their names, you should have no difficulty in obtaining receipts for the moneys advanced them.

The charge of \$ 5.00 for supplies purchased for Indians' breakfasts on train under date, May 17th, should have been supported by receipts, if it was possible to obtain them.
