Ottawa, July 30, 1920.

Sir,-

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 26th instant, furnishing an estimate of the cost of re-painting the school ceiling, having the walls alabastined, white washing the outhouses and making the repairs required at the Edmonton Indian Day School.

In reply I beg to say that you may arrange with Honore Picard to do this work. He should furnish all the material required and do the work and the cost of the same should not exceed the estimate furnished by you, namely, \$160.00. You should oversee the work and see that it is performed in a satisfactory manner. As soon as it is completed to your satisfaction you should furnish properly certified vouchers, in duplicate, covering the cost of the work. Painting and repairs enumerated by you should be carried out during the present school vacation in order that the school will be ready for occupation on the re-opening after the summer holidays.

The arrangements that you have made with Mrs. Noel Bernard to wash the floors and woodwork in the school after the other work is completed is satisfactory and you may furnish a voucher when she has done the work for an amount not to exceed your estimate of \$4.00.

It is noted that you have made arrangements to have the hay cut on the school grounds and that this work will be done for the privilege of removing the hay. This arrangement is satisfactory.
