**LYON MACKENZIE'S PAPER.**

In an article entitled "Looking Back on Canada," Mr. Fred Williams writes this interesting item for The St. Catharines Standard:

"In 1834 William Lyon Mackenzie found that he could not act as Mayor of Toronto and editor of The Colonial Advocate at the same time. Accordingly on November 4 of that year he suspended publication of his newspaper which he had conducted for 10 years. But the next March he lost the mayoralty, and replaced The Advocate with The Constitution in which, until just before his flight in 1837, he preached his political gospel. Copies of both are now quite rare and very valuable."

**The Tribulations of his Grand-**

father over The Advocate and The Constitution, one hundred years ago, are worth recalling now that Premier King is being looked to by the newspapers of Canada to defend the freedom of the press against Mr. Aberhart's Fascist legislation.
